Along with the Maine Office of Tourism, the Maine Office of Outdoor Recreation teamed up to develop the [Look Out for ME](#) program focusing on recreating responsibly.

The program emphasizes respect for the land and for the individual partaking in the outdoor recreation activity. For those who enjoy the outdoors, from hiking and camping to snowshoeing and snowmobiling, most agree Maine's mountains, waters and forests are just as worthy of respect as we do.

This includes messaging and easy to follow guidance on leaving no trace, avoiding spreading invasive species and peak hours and sticking to established trails and roads.

94% of Maine's forest land is privately owned, but more than half of it is open to public recreation. To continue this great outdoor recreation asset going well into the future, Look Out for ME promotes accessing this land respectfully and responsibly by always asking landowners for permission and checking postings first.

Whether one is venturing out into Maine's abundant public or private lands, a state park or Acadia National Park, Look Out for ME gives tips on conserving the state's natural resources, season after season, and for generations to come.
